RESOLUTION No. 6

RELATIONS BETWEEN THE ORGANIZATION OF AMERICAN STATES AND THE PAN-AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR GEOGRAPHY AND HISTORY: POWERS OF THE PAIGH SECRETARY GENERAL

The 49th Meeting of the Directing Council of the Pan-American Institute for Geography and History (PAIGH), on its virtual modality,

CONSIDERING:

The fact that the PAIGH was founded in 1928 at the Sixth International American Conference, held in Havana, Cuba;

The purposes of the PAIGH established in its Organic Statutes;¹

The fact that the PAIGH was established as the first specialized entity of the Organization of American States (OAS) in 1949;

The fact that the PAIGH has a reputable network of professional researchers;

The recommendations of the 91st and 92nd Meetings of PAIGH Authorities,

RESOLVES TO:

- 1. Give powers to the Secretary General of the PAIGH to give fresh impetus to a closer cooperation with the OAS, offering the capabilities available in these four areas of knowledge: Cartography, Geography, History and Geophysics.
- 2. Coordinate actions through the General Secretariat of the PAIGH with the backing of the Member States, through the National Sections, to seek possible and sustainable solutions in the following areas: migration, mitigation of natural disasters, climate change, Geo-Spatial Information, Statistics, and the disciplines of history and culture.
- 3. Encourage linkage to the other specialized agencies of the OAS in order to perform more specific actions.
