Famous North American historian. He graduated in Law at Harvard; nevertheless, he never acted as a lawyer. During a large part of his youth, he toured the rivers and forests of the mountains of New England, a landscape that enchanted him so much that he decided to research and write about the conflicts involving warfare between Britain and France, nations which, on several occasions disputed this territory between them.

Wrote: *France and England in North America*, 1865 / *History of the conspiracy of Pontiac*, 1851 / *The Pioneers of France in the New World*, 1865 / *The Jesuits in North America in the Seventeenth Century*, 1867 / *The Old Regime in Canada*, 1874.
